## Intergenerational Programs

## build bridges across generations while helping children thrive.

"Around the United States, intergenerational friendships are the exception rather than the rule: for the most part, age segregation prevails," report Generations United and The Eisner Foundation.

"Kids spend their days at school, mostly among peers born the same year they were. Young and middle-aged adults cluster at work. And elders gather for clubs, classes, and meals that often expressly bar the young. Millions of college students and elders live in age-restricted housing, and most American neighborhoods skew young or old."

America wasn't always this way. More important, it doesn't need to be this way now.

A benevolent army of JCA volunteers age 50 and better helps students from pre-kindergarten through high school to succeed in school and life. In addition, student volunteers befriend older adults in nursing homes, assisted living centers and adult day programs.

"I never really talked to an older person before," admitted one high schooler to his new but much older friend, Sam. "But you're actually pretty cool."

Sam grinned from ear to ear. "I didn't know they still used the word cool," Sam said. "But that's me."

The award-winning programs of the JCA Heyman Interages® Center run the gamut from helping kids with the basics of reading, math and science ... to lifestyle discussions ... to Makeover Madness, through which cosmetology students bring joy and glamor to institutionalized elders who have yearned for both of those things. Our Intergenerational Resource Center helps professionals and organizations share innovative ideas and learn from our success.

#### The Career Gateway!

Many middle-aged and older adults want to earn a fair day's wage for a fair day's work just as they did at every other age and stage of life. Often, however, younger applicants win out.

Age discrimination is alive and well in the National Capital Region. The Career Gateway is one effective way to arm oneself against it.

Then again, not all turndowns come from discriminatory hiring practices and not all layoffs target older adults unfairly. Older jobseekers are famously bad at marketing themselves. Many also lack the mindset and certain skills that today's employers demand.

Our Career Gateway program is an innovative, multi-day workshop especially designed to help jobseekers age 50+ to improve their job-search skills. It includes intensive training, individual attention, take-home materials and a mentor who is ready, willing and able to provide one-on-one support at no additional cost.

#### The program works!

Our typical participant has been unemployed for one to two years; many have been job-hunting even longer. Within three to six months of graduation, however, most of those who are still actively looking for work have landed meaningful employment either full or part time or have had success in landing promising job interviews.

Classes are small and fill-up fast. We charge a small registration fee, and we require that Gateway students have at least basic computer skills because some classwork is online.

#### **Senior Community Service Employment Program (SCSEP)**

"I am reinventing my life one day at time," said a participant in our Senior Community Service Employment Program.

Public grants enable SCSEP to provide on-the-job training and a minimum wage for scores of low-income adults age 55 and older who live in Montgomery or Frederick Counties, Md. Trainees build their skills while working at local nonprofits and government agencies. Those training sites get SCSEP workers free in return for the supervision and coaching they provide.

The Program's goal is to find each trainee — "intern" — a regular job. Over the 40+ years that JCA has been running the Program, we have helped hundreds of older adults achieve the independence they crave and deserve.

There are usually more jobseekers than internships available, however. We encourage qualified jobseekers to contact us and complete the necessary sign-up forms because as one staff member wisely put it, "The only way to get off a wait list is to get on it first."

We give priority to veterans, persons who are homeless and certain other high-need individuals.
